Today Warren Featherbone has helped create <i>Featherbone Communiversi</i> located in Gainesville, GA. <i>Featherbone Communiversi</i> is a learning community, which provides collaborative, cross-generational learning through a unique alliance among educational institutions. It is the first of its kind in the United States. Partner institutions are Brenau University, Lanier Technical College, Georgia Tech University, the University of Georgia, and INK (Interactive Neighborhood for Kids).</p>
