Shelly presented the treasurer's report in Lori's absence.

- As of November 30, our total assets are \$1,115,000.00.
- Accounts still in flux from midwinter
- Visa has been paid down but still has \$4,692.00 balance.
- Line item for \$250,000 in budget & grants under income but then shown as expense because \$250,000 CD was opened for a nine-month term.

- Even though we show a negative all expenses are on track for this time of year.
- Stephen interjects that while the Association has strong balances there are \$800,000 in contractual liabilities
- Taxes are complete for this year
- W-9's and 1099's will be complete the first of January. 1099's mainly for people that we wrote checks to who presented or anybody who made over \$600.00.
- o Workman's Comp Policy is coming due in January. Association address changed due to move. When paperwork complete, ADP will send to us. ADP will continue to handle this for the new year.
